

1 THE CHAIRMAN: And the lack of disqualifica-  
2 tions under Section 4.

3 MR. MILES: Yes.

4 DR. BARD: That would do it.

5 MR. SCANLAN: I still don't understand whether  
6 Mr. Miles' motion accommodates Dr. Jenkins' principle.  
7 Could a municipality under Mr. Miles' motion impose a  
8 minimum property ownership qualification or couldn't it?

9 MR. CASE: It could.

10 MR. MILES: Yes.

11 MR. SCANLAN: That is what you don't want.

12 MR. MILES: Because it is alternative,  
13 either/or; either property restrictions or residency.

14 MR. CASE: But it couldn't impose illiteracy  
15 conditions.

16 MR. MILES: That is right, or a poll tax or  
17 anything else.

18 MR. CASE: Poll tax, race, creed, color.

19 DR. TEMPLETON: Mr. Chairman, I appreciate  
20 this consideration of Mr. Miles because my sole concern  
21 is that the local requirements shall not be more restrictive
