

1 I do not think they are insuperable problems. Many of
2 the reports are going over ground which we have been
3 over before and I don't think you will have any great
4 difficulty in following.

5 A number of the reports are, however, entirely
6 new. For instance, the report of the Judiciary Depart-
7 ment and the report of the Committee on Finance and
8 Taxation.

9 In order to accommodate the other engagements
10 of some members of the Commission, we have scheduled
11 for today the reports to be presented by Chairmen or
12 reporters who for one reason or other are unable to be
13 here tomorrow. As most of you know, Professor Asper
14 leaves for California in a matter of a few weeks. He
15 is the reporter for the Committee on Elective Franchise
16 and Declaration of Rights. The two reports presented
17 today hopefully would be the final reports of that
18 Committee and will be the first on our agenda.

19 Dr. Bard has a longstanding engagement or
20 series of engagements for Monday which make it impossible
21 for him to be here tomorrow. His report is scheduled,
