

Mr. Smith presented the following memorial:

On motion of Mr. Kimmel,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Kimmel, Smith, and Duvall to report a bill to authorize the County Commissioners of Frederick county to build a new Court House for Frederick county, to borrow money on the credit of the county, to issue bonds for the payment of the same, and to levy taxes on the assessable property of the county to redeem said bonds, and to pay the interest thereon.

Mr. Bradley submitted the following message:
