Mr. Wallis, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to amend article IV of the Code of Public Laws relating to the city of Baltimore, by authorizing the Board of Police of said city to cause the closing of bar-rooms, bars, drinking houses and liquor shops in said city, and the sale or furnishing of liquor thereat when necessary for the preservation of the public peace;
