

Howard County shall provide ~~from private and public revenue sources a partial~~ a matching fund of at least \$550,000 and the Central Maryland Chapter of the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc. or the County Executive and County Council of Howard County shall provide a ~~partial~~ matching fund of at least \$14,000. ~~The recipient~~ No part of an applicant's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. The No part of the fund may consist of real property, in-kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter, and the Board's decision is final. The County Executive and County Council of Howard County and the Central Maryland Chapter of the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc. have until June 1, 1992, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 1, 1992, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in § 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(6) (a) The County Executive and County Council of Howard County or the Central Maryland Chapter of the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc. shall grant and convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of its interest in the Pfeiffer School, Patapsco Female Institute, Troy Hill Mansion, and Ellicott City Colored School:

(i) On the land or such portion of the land acceptable to the Trust;
and
(ii) On the exterior and interior, where appropriate, of the historic structures.

(b) The easement must be in form and substance acceptable to the Trust and the extent of the interest to be encumbered must be acceptable to the Trust.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1990.

(House Bill 90)

AN ACT concerning

Howard County - Sheriff - Salary

Ho. Co. 3-90

FOR the purpose of increasing the salary of the Howard County Sheriff; and providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent Sheriff of Howard County.
