

- (1) A banking institution as defined in § 1-101 of the Financial Institutions Article;
- (2) A credit union as described in § 6-201 of the Financial Institutions Article;
- (3) A savings and loan association as defined in § 8-101 of the Financial Institutions Article; or
- (4) A subsidiary of a banking institution, credit union, or savings and loan association described in this subsection.

(c) This section may not be construed to affect the liability of a person in any capacity other than the person's capacity as a director or officer] AS DESCRIBED UNDER ~~TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 3~~ § 5-349 OF THE COURTS AND JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS ARTICLE.

8-601.

(a) The liability of a real estate investment trust extends to as much of the trust estate, including the whole, as necessary to discharge the liability.

(b) A shareholder or trustee [is not personally liable for the obligations of the trust. However, if a trustee otherwise would be liable, this section does not relieve him from any liability to the trust or its security holders for any act which constitutes:

- (1) Bad faith;
- (2) Willful misfeasance;
- (3) Gross negligence; or

(4) Reckless disregard of his duties] OF A REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT TRUST SHALL HAVE THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY DESCRIBED UNDER ~~TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 3~~ § 5-350 OF THE COURTS AND JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS ARTICLE.

A person admitted as a partner into an existing partnership [is liable for all the obligations of the partnership arising before his admission as though he had been a partner when the obligations were incurred, except that this liability shall be satisfied only out of partnership property] SHALL HAVE THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY DESCRIBED UNDER ~~TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 3~~ § 5-351 OF THE COURTS AND JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS ARTICLE.
