

**CHAP. 242.** of Basil Bowling, late sheriff of Prince-George's county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered, to allow credit to the said Basil Bowling for all such insolvencies, on americiaments, taxes in chancery, and fines and forfeitures, as the justices of the levy court of Prince-George's county shall certify that the said Basil Bowling is fairly and justly entitled to, and that those persons were actually insolvent at the time the claims against them became due; *Provided*, that the claim for those credits shall be transmitted to the treasurer of the western shore on or before the first day of July next.

2. *And be it enacted*, That all further proceedings on the part of the state, against the said Basil Bowling, and his securities, are hereby suspended until the next meeting of the legislature.

3. *And be it enacted*, That the said Basil enter into bond to the orphans' court of Prince-George's county, with such security as they shall approve, conditioned to pay all monies he owes the state, before he shall derive any benefit from this act.

**CHAP. CXXLIH.**

Passed Mar 12 1827 An Act for the relief of sundry Poor Persons in the several Counties therein mentioned.

1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the levy courts of Kent, Anne-Arundel, Prince-George's, Queen-Anne's, Worcester, Harford, Caroline and Montgomery counties, be and they are hereby severally authorised, directed and empowered, at their annual meeting, so long as they shall see cause so to do, to assess and levy on the assessable property of said counties, for the use of the several persons hereinafter mentioned, any sum of money, not exceeding the several sums annexed to their respective names, viz. In Kent county, for the widow of Thomas Salway thirty dollars, for Nathaniel Redding, in addition to the sum now allowed him, ten dollars, for Milcah Hatcheson thirty dollars, for Mary Ann Brown thirty dollars, for the orphan child of William Hart twenty-five dollars, for Sarah Taylor thirty dollars, for Elizabeth Davis thirty dollars, for Rebecca Davis thirty dollars. In Anne-Arundel county, for Moses Deaver twenty dollars, for William Hood twenty dollars, for Edward Stewart twenty dollars, for Elizabeth Watson thirty dollars, for Mary Atwell twenty dollars, for Elizabeth Merrikin twenty dollars, for Ellen Burnett twenty dollars, for Caleb Stewart forty dollars, for Ann Merrikin twenty-five dollars, for Rachel Fennell fifteen dollars, for Lewis Weston twenty dollars, for Mary Johnson thirty dollars, for Joshua Stockett, free negro, ten dollars, for Elizabeth Dadds fifteen dollars, for Jane Gaither fifteen dollars, for Thomas Cadle twenty dollars, for John Abrams thirty dollars, for Rachel Johnson fifteen dollars, for Margaret Jacob fifteen dollars, for Sarah Bush fifteen dollars, for Sarah Tydings fifteen dollars, payable to Ellen Griffith.
