

source of information about its publication, whether bibliographies, newspaper advertisements, or both. When this unlocated material is listed in Evans' American Bibliography, these notes from contemporary sources give clues to where Evans found his information.

9. References to bibliographies in which the publications have been listed.

10. Location in libraries. Underlining signifies that the writer has personally examined the copy. Some other locations have been verified. No attempt has been made to locate copies in private libraries or in booksellers' collections outside Maryland, except in the case of unique copies.

A year's issue of one newspaper or periodical title has been listed as one item.

Only the library where most of the issues of a newspaper have been examined by the writer, has been listed. In cases where other issues are known to exist, the reader is referred to C.S. Brigham's Bibliography of American Newspapers for additional locations.

In the case of newspapers, supplements and extraordinary editions have not been listed, except when they were issued in the form of pamphlets. In this case, the pamphlet is listed under its own author. For newspapers and other publications without title-pages, the
