TEACHING AND LEARNING

On December 5th, Professor John W. McCleary, of the History Department of State Teachers' College, Towson, brought his class over, to offer them a tour of the Hall of Records, and on April 22nd, Professor Rhoda Dorsey brought her history class from Goucher College for the same purpose.
