TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE ARCHIVIST FOR FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1963 THROUGH JUNE 30, 1964.

This report signalled the conclusion of our county land record project and described the next step in gathering here, at the Hall of Records, county records for security and for the convenience of research.

MARYLAND MANUAL, 1965-1966

Although this *Manual* was not scheduled to appear until January 1966, work was begun on it during the 1965 legislative session. Only in this way can we meet our schedule. The size of the edition was increased again to 6,200 copies from 5,700 copies in order to take care of the rapid expansion of our school system and of our county libraries.
