CHAPTER 49.

Passed February 11
1828.

An act to relieve the Baltimore and Havre de Grace turnpike company from paying the Levy Court of Harford county for a county road,

Part act of 1826,
chapter 193 repeal-
ed:

SECTION. 1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That so much of the act, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de Grace, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty six, chapter one hundred and ninety three, as requires the said company to remunerate to the levy court of Harford county, all the expenses already incurred in the laying out and opening of the road from the town of Bush to the bridge at or near Port Deposit, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed: Provided that said company will not put any gate or gates on the bed of the old road leading from Bush to Port Deposit.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Baltimore and Havre de Grace turnpike company shall be, and they are hereby required, should they use any of the said county road, to pay to the levy court of Harford county for all that they use of it, so soon as they take possession of the same, at the same rate per mile that the county paid for opening and making said road, and no more.

CHAPTER 50.

Passed February 6

An act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Worcester county into election districts.

Repeal

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Worcester county into five election districts, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Seven districts.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That Worcester county shall be divided and laid off into seven separate election districts: whereof the present district called and known as number four or Johnson's district, and the district called and known as number five or Dennis' district, shall be divided into four separate election districts, and the present districts, viz: number one or Costen's district, and number two or Snow Hill district, and number three or Berlin district, to be and remain as they now are,

Confirmatory pro-
vision.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That if this act shall be confirmed by the next General Assembly after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the constitution and form of government directs, in such case this act and the alterations in the said constitution contained therein shall be considered as a part, and shall constitute and
