

then only after permission from the owner or possessor thereof, first had and obtained, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction before a justice of the peace of the said county or Circuit Court thereof, be fined not exceeding \$25 for each and every offense, and stand committed until fine and costs are paid, or be sentenced to the House of Correction not exceeding six months; all fines under this section shall go to the informer.

SEC. C. Any person who shall use any lights at night in hunting wild ducks, geese or musk-rats in Wicomico county, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction before a justice of the peace of the said county or the Circuit Court thereof, be fined not less than \$25 for each and every offense, and stand committed until fine and costs are paid; all fines under this section shall go to the informer. Unlawful to use lights.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the Treasurer of the State Board of Education, the amount of sundry bills paid by him for repairs to the State Normal School building.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer of Maryland, to pay the Treasurer of the State Board of Education the sum of two thousand two hundred and sixty-five dollars and seventy-three cents, being the amount of sundry bills paid by him under the direction of the State Board of Education, for material furnished and work done at the Maryland State Normal School building, in the years eighteen hundred and ninety-two and eighteen hundred and ninety-three, to the following persons and firms, viz: To C. J. Stewart and Sons, the sum of seventy-nine dollars and To pay claims.
