

at the south side of the public landing in Green lane and running thence easterly bounding on the south side of Green lane to the public road, leading from Rock Hall cross roads to Grey's Inn, and continuing said line easterly 200 feet to a point on Mr. Kimble's farm marked by a stone; thence by a straight line to a stone on the east side of the public road leading from Rock Hall to Chestertown, said point being distant 100 feet south from the Arch bridge over Grey's Inn creek, said point being marked by a stone; thence by a straight line northwesterly to a point on the north side of the Haven road, marked by a stone; thence north parallel with the public road leading from Rock Hall cross roads to Denly 200 feet; thence west to W. M. Miller's line; thence by a straight line to the extreme end of Windmill point; thence by a straight line to place of beginning.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the legal voters of Rock Hall who have resided within the corporate limits six months preceding an election, and who are assessed for taxes on real and personal property to the amount of one hundred dollars or more, and all persons who own and are assessed for taxes on any interest in real or personal estate in said town to the value of one hundred dollars or over, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, shall elect by ballot, on the first Saturday of May of each year, commencing the first Saturday of May, 1908, five councilmen of the said town of Rock Hall, all of whom shall be qualified voters of said town, and above twenty-one years of age, and shall serve without pay. And until the first Saturday in May, 1908, and until their successors shall qualify, R. S. Crew, A. Alexander, J. A. Casey, T. B. Durdning and Joseph Downey shall be and are hereby constituted councilmen of said town of Rock Hall. A majority of said Councilmen shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Councilmen so elected shall meet on the third Saturday in May of each year, or as soon after said date as possible, and take the oath of office to support and maintain the Constitution and laws of the State of Maryland, and to perform the duties of their offices as Councilmen of Rock Hall to the best of their ability, without fear, favor, affection or partiality. They shall choose one of their number as their president, who shall also act as Mayor and executive officer of the said town of Rock Hall. The said Councilmen shall also choose, not necessarily from among their own number, a secretary and treasurer, who shall continue in office during the term for which said Councilmen are elected, unless sooner removed for cause by said Councilmen, and the said Councilmen shall require of said treasurer a bond in the penalty to be by them fixed, conditioned to the faithful discharge of his duties as such
