

91. All armories owned by the State of Maryland, and all buildings occupied, leased or rented by or in behalf of the State for the purpose of organizing, training and equipping such State military forces as may now or hereafter be authorized by law, shall be under the management and control of the State Armory Commission hereby created. Said Commission shall consist of the Governor, the Adjutant General and the Comptroller. Said Commission shall be vested with the management, care, control and maintenance of the armories and other buildings aforesaid, together with all power and authority necessary or desirable for such purposes, and with the right to make and enforce all reasonable rules and regulations in connection therewith.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That nothing in this Act shall be construed to interfere with or abrogate the duties or powers of building commissions and committees created for the purpose of constructing and equipping armories authorized by the laws of the State. Any monies in the hands of or due to the Board of Trustees of the Fifth Regiment Armory, shall be paid to the State Armory Commission.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect on and after June 1, 1918.

CHAPTER 144.

AN ACT to legalize Volume 4 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, edited by George P. Bagby, and make it, in connection with Volumes 1, 2 and 3 of said Code, Evidence of the Law.

WHEREAS, the General Assembly at its sessions of 1912 and 1914 legalized and made evidence of the Law Volumes 1, 2 and 3 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, edited by George P. Bagby, which completed the codification of the Public General Laws of the State down to and inclusive of the Acts of 1914; and

WHEREAS, Volume 4 of the Annotated Code of Maryland now in course of preparation, will include the Public General Acts of 1916, 1917 and 1918, and thus complete to the date of its
