
Chapter VI.—Public Buildings for Religious Purposes.

Baptist Churches.—1st. Baptist, at the corner of Lombard and Sharp streets. This building is in a circular form, having a portico, with six Doric columns on the west side. The architect was Mr. Mills. Cost \$50,000. Pastor Reverend S. P. Hill; 2d. Baptist, in Fleet street, Fell's Point, pastor, J. Healy, 3d. or Ebenezer Baptist, North Calvert, between Saratoga and Lexington streets. Mount Zion—Corner Exeter and Balt, Total 4.

Bethel, or Seamen's Church,—On Fell's Point, fronting the harbor. This building, though not very large, is handsome and convenient.
