

merchandise intended for transportation on the rail-road, must be deposited, is in Pratt street, a short distance from Light street wharf. 2d. The Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail-Road is to extend from this city to York, Pa. a distance of fifty-nine miles and a half. Concerning the advantages of these rail-roads we have already spoken.

Post Office.—The Baltimore city post office, is on the north east corner of North and Fayette streets. The rates of postage, established by law, are as follows:

Double letters, or those consisting of two pieces of paper, charged double these rates. Triple or quadruple letters in the same proportion.

Letters, which weigh an ounce or more, are charged with quadruple postage, per ounce.

Letters or packages delivered at the same post office where they are lodged are charged with *one cent* postage.

Ship letters, if delivered at the office of the port where the vessel arrives, pay *six cents* postage, but if conveyed from thence by mail to any other place, only *two cents* in addition to the ordinary rates of postage.
