BALTIMORE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

The Public Schools in Baltimore are a High School for boys and six primary schools for both sexes; they are managed by a Board of Commissioners, who receive their appointment annually from the City Council.

The funds for the support of the Schools are raised, principally, by a light tax on the taxable property of the inhabitants the charge for tuition being merely nominal-only one dollar a quarter, and this entitles the pupil to the use of the books and other property of the school.

The system of instruction in all the Primary Schools is that of
