## BALTIMORE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

The Public Schools in Baltimore are a High School for boys and six primary schools for both sexes; they are managed by a Board of Commissioners, who receive their appointment annually from the City Council.

The funds for the support of the Schools are raised, principally, by a light tax on the taxable property of the inhabitants; the charge for tuition being merely nominal—only one dollar a quarter, and this entitles the pupil to the use of the books and other property of the school.

The system of instruction in all the Primary Schools is that of "simultaneous recitations."
