BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND ENGLAND.

Cunard's Line, from Liverpool to Boston, leaves each port twice every month. Steam Navigation Company's Line, from Liverpool, London and Bristol, New York.

Each of the above lines carry a Mail, but Cunard's is free to Liverpool, except the inland postage from the place of deposite to Boston must be paid. The rates postage from New York are as follow—Government postmasters of the place whe fetters are deposited, are authorised to receive: for single letters 25 cents; double lette 50 cents; triple letters, 75 cents; quadruple letters, 25; package of letters, per ox. \$\\$\text{newspapers, each 2 cents; magazines, pamphlets, &c. per sheet, 2 cents.
