

on each side, to reach an entry into the basement. A square pedestal of 21 feet and 7 in height, is raised on the preceding base, and the column, whose exterior surface is perfectly smooth and without ornament, stands on this pedestal. It has 20 feet diameter at its base, and 14 feet at its summit; on which rests, the colossal statue of the Father of his Country. The whole height from the ground is 176 1-2 feet. It is all built of white marble, from the quarries of this country, and has a circular flight of 228 steps to the top, in the interior of the monument. The design was furnished by Mr. Robert Mills, architect. The statue is 16 1-2 feet high, although it appears from below of the natural size; it weighs 7 tons and cost \$7500 to carve it, and between 2 and \$3000 to raise it; Signior Andre Cavaci, was the sculptor.—*Varle's View of Baltimore.*
