

Memorandum that the above named Mondrac Price conveyed his right and title to the above lott No. 55 to Capt. Robt. Gordon, of Annapolis and his heirs forever, who complied with the requisites mentioned in the Act of Assembly for Baltimore Town, James Jackson also conveyed his right to ye lott No. 38, unto Mr. Samuel Peel and his heirs, who duly complied with sd. requisites.

On Thursday the 15th of January 1729 '30 the three following lotts were taken up by the underwritten gentlemen, but they forfeited their right thereto by not building thereupon as required by Act of Assembly. Thomas Sheredine, No. 44, William Buckner, No. 53, James Powell, No. 26.

On Friday ye 16th January 1729 '30 the two following lotts were taken up by the following gentlemen, viz. Chas. Ridgely, No. 44, Luke Trotten, No. 36. Some time afterwards, the said Ridgely conveyed the said lot No. 54 to Mr. John Diggs, who built upon the same as required by Act of Assembly in due time.

The above sd Luke Trotten also conveyed his right to the said lot No. 36 unto Mr. Philip Jones, jr. who complied with the requisites of the Act of Assembly.

On Monday 19 January 1729 '30, the two following lotts were taken up by the underwritten gentlemen who forfeited their right thereto by not building thereupon, viz. Capt. Robert North, No. 10, Richard Hewitt, 35.

On the same day Mr. Lloyd Harris took up the lott No. 50 and fully complied with the requisites in the Act of Assembly in due time.

On Tuesday following being the 20th day of January 1729 '30, Capt. Thomas Sheredine took up the lott No. 14, in the name and for the use of his son Daniel Sheredine, but suffer'd their right thereto to become void for want of building thereon as by Act of Assembly enjoyn'd.

On Wednesday being 21st January 1729 '30, Mr. Lloyd Harris took up the lott No. 56 in the name of John Gorsuch, which Gorsuch afterward conveyed his right thereto unto the said Lloyd Harris, which sd Harris built upon as required by Act of Assembly.

Aprile 18th 1730, David Robinson took up in Baltimore Town the lott No. 47 and afterwards conveyed his right thereto unto Mr. Richard Gist, who built thereon as by Act of Assembly required.

July 1st 1730, Mr. John Risteau took the lott No. 15 in Baltimore Town and built thereon.

August 18th 1730, Mr. William Hammond, took up the lott No. 46.

March 1st 1730 '1 Martine Parlett took up the lott No. 42, in Baltimore Town and forfeited his right thereto by neglecting to build thereon.
