

verse north forty-nine and one-quarter degrees west), seventeen hundred and forty-two feet to a stone to be set, thence at right-angles south forty and three-quarters degrees west, twelve hundred and fifty feet, thence north forty-nine and one-quarter degrees west fourteen hundred and eighty-six feet to the aforesaid railroad line, thence binding thereon (about) south twenty-seven and one-half degrees west, twelve hundred and sixty-four feet to the beginning.

3. All male citizens residing within the corporate limits of said town above the age of twenty-one years, and assessed on the tax books of said town with one hundred dollars' worth of real or personal property, all taxes due and in arrears on which have been paid, and who have resided in said town for three months next previous to the election at which they offer to vote, shall, on the first Saturday of May in the year 1904 and on said Saturday every two years thereafter elect by ballot, five freeholders of said town, each of whom has resided therein for six months next preceding such election, as Commissioners of Aberdeen, to serve for two years or until their successors shall be elected and have qualified; and they shall receive no pay for their services. The judges of election shall have access to the tax books of said town for the purpose of determining the qualification of any voter whose right to vote is questioned.

4. The commissioners shall bi-annually on or before the first Saturday in April, give notice by hand-bills or by publication in some newspaper published in said town of the election, and shall appoint three judges who shall conduct the election according to the election laws of the State of Maryland, except that the polls shall be opened at twelve o'clock M. and close at six o'clock P. M. The first election held under this Act shall be held on the first Saturday of May, 1892, and it shall be the duty of the County Commissioners of Harford County to designate the place, and appoint the judges of said election.

5. The commissioners shall meet in said town on or before the first Saturday in June next succeeding their election, and as often thereafter as may be necessary, to discharge the duties of their office, not less, however, than once in every three months.

6. The commissioners, shall, on their first meeting, after an election, elect one of their number to be president of the board, and all vacancies in the board of commissioners shall
