

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That the weighing apparatus shall be adjusted at least once in six months, by the standard of weights for the city of Baltimore, the expenses of which, together with all the expense for repairs, shall be paid exclusively by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

CHAP. 239.

Adjusted

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted*, That all fines or forfeitures imposed by this act, may be recovered with costs, in the name of the Mayor and City Council, in the same manner that small debts are now recovered before justices of the peace, and the same when recovered shall go one half to the informer, and the other half to the city.

Fines recoverable, &c.

SEC. 11. *And be it enacted*, That each of the said inspectors shall give bond to the Mayor and City Council in the sum of two thousand dollars, for the true and faithful performance of the duties of his office, and all monies received by him in his capacity of inspector of hay and straw, shall, under oath, after deducting two-thirds of said monies for his salary, be paid over monthly to the Register of said city, for the use thereof.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted*, That all laws or parts of laws inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 239.

An act to provide for the extension of the charters of certain Banks therein mentioned.

Passed Mar. 21, 1837.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the charters of the Farmers Bank of Maryland and its branches, the Frederick County Bank, the Farmers and Mechanics Bank of Frederick County, the Hagerstown Bank, the Bank of Washington County, and the Cumberland Bank of Allegany, be, and they are hereby severally extended and continued in force to the first day of January, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty, and to the end of the next session of the General Assembly thereafter.
