No. 32.

Resolution in favour of Mahlon Talbot.

Passed Mar. 9,
1837.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Mahlon Talbot, late sheriff of Frederick county, the sum of fifty-eight dollars, being so much money heretofore paid into the treasury for certain fines imposed by Frederick county court by the said Talbot.

No. 33.

Resolution in favor of Mary Ford.

Passed Mar. 4,
1837.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Mary Ford, widow of Joseph Ford, or order, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the half pay of a second lieutenant during her life, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

No. 34.

Preamble and Resolution in favor of the securities of Samnel Warnick, of Allegany county.

Passed Mar. 9,
1837.

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly that at April term of Allegany county court, eighteen hundred and thirty-six, a certain Samuel Warnick of said county was indicted by the grand jury of said county for committing forgery; *and whereas*, John Warnick, William Shaw and George Smarr, entered into a bond commonly called a bond of recognizance in the sum of five hundred dollars, for the appearance of said Samuel Warnick at October term of Allegany county
