

CHAP. 7.

Duration of charter

Section 10. *And be it enacted*, That this charter shall continue and be in force until the first day of January eighteen hundred and sixty, and to the end of the next general assembly thereafter.

CHAP. VIII.

Passed Jan 21, 1820

An Act to preserve the Side Walks in the Village of Liberty, in Frederick County.

Prohibition for driving upon pavements

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to ride, drive or lead, any horse, or drive any team or carriage whatever, upon any pavement on the side walks within the limits of said village.

Penalty for so doing

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That if any person or persons, after the passage of this act, shall ride, drive or lead, any horse, or drive any team or carriage whatever, upon any pavement on the side walks in said village, or its limits, such person or persons so offending, shall forfeit and pay for each and every offence, a fine not exceeding the sum of two dollars, to be recovered in the name of the state, before any justice of the peace, as other small debts are recovered, for the use of said village, to be appropriated to the improvement of the side walks.

Right to cross footways, &c

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That nothing in this act contained shall be construed to extend to, or affect, the right of any person to pass across said foot walks in going from, or returning to, the premises of which he or she may be in possession.

CHAP. IX.

Passed Jan 22, 1820

An Act to incorporate the Trustees of the Particular Baptist Church in Baltimore County.

Preamble

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that on the twenty-seventh day of February seventeen hundred and seventy, a certain Jonathan Plowman conveyed to John Davis, pastor, John Whitaker and Samuel Lane, particular Baptists, a piece or parcel of land, contented for fifteen acres, for the sole use of a meeting house for the worship of God, for ever; and it being represented that the said John Davis, John Whitaker and Samuel Lane, are all dead or removed out of the state; and it also appearing that the members of the said church, at a regular meeting of the congregation, did appoint Thomas Layman, John Perigoy and Benjamin Buckingham, to act as trustees for the same; therefore,
