Passed Feb 22, 1889. A Resolution in favor of Martin Bourke and Thomas Morgan.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all prosecutions in Washington county court against Martin Bourke and Thomas Morgan, for retailing merchandize without a license, be and the same are hereby ordered and directed to be discontinued, they having had at the time presentments were made against them, a pedlar's license, for which they paid forty dollars, and have since obtained a traders license, and paid the sum of twelve dollars for the same.
