 form a<sup>r</sup>. made little regarding but minding and fraudulently intending the said Gale and Bensonly in  
 this Particular craftily and s<sup>r</sup>. to deceive and defraud the sum of money s<sup>r</sup>. unto the said Gale and  
 Bensonly hath not paid or them for the same in any sort Contented (altho the same to do the same  
 Southy afterwards to wit the same day and year a<sup>r</sup>. and after since at the County s<sup>r</sup>. by the said Gale  
 and Bensonly was Required) but the same to him to pay he has to altho they both Requested and still  
 doth Refuse and Unjustly deny Whereas the said Gale and Bensonly they are wrong and their
