thereabouts being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Depoeth as
follows that about thirty nine years ago or thereabouts namely under King William
the Third he was present and Deceased Thence this Defendant a marked White
Oak Standson the North East Corner of a Hammock Call'd of Long Hammock

SOMERSET to wit the Deposition of Capt James Gunby aged thirty four years or there
abouts being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Depoeth as follows that
about eighteen years ago or thereabouts that John William Dale of Somerset County Deceased
and his Children's Executors Deceased and Southy Whittington was a me Judge
that had been lately blown down at age the said Gunby was the second Wounder of a
certain Parcel of Land Called Nicholsons et al and also John William first Wounder of a
certain Parcel of Land and Thence he by the said William further this Defendant saith
that which place there was then set up a marked Cedar Stake in a me marked
in a me marked with sixteen marks which were made about one hundred
and twenty or thereabouts a distance that leads out of Wick Creek to a
Journey commonly by the name of the Wood Mill

being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Depoeth as follows that about
thirty years ago or thereabouts John William Dale of Somerset County Deceased and

and further this Defendant saith
