Sec. 5. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the Directors, at least once in every six months, to appoint, from the members of the corporation, three competent persons to investigate the affairs of the said corporation, and to make out a report thereof, which report shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose, that shall be open for the inspection, at all times, of any depositor or member; and it shall be the duty of the Directors, on the first Monday of February, and on the first Monday of August, in each and every year, to make and declare such dividends of the profits as shall have been made by the investments hereinbefore provided for, after paying the expenses of the Institution, and the same to pay over unto the members of the said corporation, or their legal representatives, within ten days thereafter.

Sec. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the concerns of the institution hereby intended to be incorporated, shall be at all times subject to the inspection of the Treasurer of the Western Shore, or of such other officer or agent of the State as may be selected for that purpose by either branch of the Legislature.

Sec. 7. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall be and continue in force until the year eighteen hundred and forty-five, and until the end of the first session of the General Assembly that shall happen thereafter.

CHAPTER 239.

Passed Mar. 16, 1833

An act to authorise the Levy court of Dorchester county, to levy a sum of money for the purpose of building a bridge across Slaughter creek, in said county.

Levy court to appoint commissioners.

To examine and survey.

Select site.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Levy court of Dorchester county, be, and they are hereby authorised to appoint, as soon as practicable after the passage of this act, five sensible and discreet men, as commissioners to survey, examine and select the most suitable and convenient place to build a bridge, over Slaughter creek, somewhere between the place where the present upper Ferry is now kept, and the Walnut landing, on said creek, which said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall as soon as practicable, after their said appointment, proceed to examine, survey and locate some suitable place to build the said bridge, and shall also examine,
