

those inconveniences, which a long time have hindered, and of the meanes which have helped forward other Plantations; and having fully satisfied himselfe, not onely by the papers his noble Father, an eye-witnesse left him, of the Excellency of the land: but by others also, who daily come from that, and the places nigh upon it; as also by the true printed Historie of Captaine SMITH, who first discovered it, confirmed by hundreds living in this City of *London*, who have beene themselves there, and meane to returne thither againe, who all goe in Conforinity. My Lord resolves by the favour of GOD, to make Saile for the said *Country* about the middle of *September* next ensuing, and proposeth many very large conditions, to such as shall for the same ends joyne with him in this honorable Action. Whereof the chiefe is this, that besides honors and place which freely he meaneth to conferre upon the merits of Bloud, Valour, Vertue, and larger Ventures of Gentlemen, for every hundred pounds ventur'd in Transportation of five able men (being twenty pound a man) which will transport and furnish them with Armes, Tooles, Cloathes, Vtensils and Victuals for one twelve-Month; whether they goe in person, or commit their men and mony to my Lord's Officer appointed for that purpose: or to any other who will take care of them and it, and receive and use the dividend of land for their benefit; shall receive of my Lord a mannor of good Land, to the full quantity of 2000. Akers, for them and their heyres for ever in that Country; besides, a good share in a rich Trade hereafter mentioned, and sundry other encouragements & priviledges if they go in this first Voyage; which, when they repayre to my Lord, they shall better understand. And this for every hundred pound ventured by one or more joyned together, and the same in proportion is to be held whether more or lesse be ventured.
