The bill, entitled, An act authorising the court of chancery to decree in the case therein mentioned, the bill for the preservation of the navigation of Cabin creek, the bill for the preservation of the navigation of the north-west branch of Nanticoke river, in Dorchester county, were read the second time and passed.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury to the executive of the state of Maryland, any sum or sums of money in the aggregate amount not exceeding three hundred pounds, in addition to the sum now allowed by law, to defray the expenses and incidental charges of government.
