did steal take and bear away contrary to the peace of the said Lord proptly his
good rule and Government and against the form of the act of asembly in such
case lately made and provided Test J^{as} Amys for Cuzard on the same

Indictment was endorsed as followeth. True bill by Ed^{ward} Borrell foreman

And the said Thomas Farrington in his proper person cometh and saith
that he is in no sort guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by
the said Indictment it is alleged and thereof he putteth himself upon the
Country

And he who followeth for the Lord proptly in like manner saith he
is guilty

Mercurius Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County that he
immediately Cause to come here twelve shillings. By whom he who mentioned because
as well he. Of which said procept the said Sheriff to wit John Gresham Gent
now here at this day to wit the third Tuesday in August being the first month day of
said Month Anno Domini 1698 hundred and thirty two makes return that
he hath here ready twelve shillings as by his procept he was Committed and now
here afterwards to wit the day and year last mentioned come against the said
proptly by his atty and the said Thomas Farrington in his proper
and the Jurors of that Jury being Impannell'd and called likewise came to
wit Robert Duns Morgan Hurl George Medford Bulmar Medford Francis
Barney Jeremiah Cooington John True William Clarke John Williams
George Browning Nath^l Massey William Woodland who being duly
Elected tryd and Sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their
Oath do say that Thomas Farrington is not guilty of the felony
as above mentioned and by Robert Duns there foreman all so say
