Memorandum That on the first Monday of April Anno  
Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty three  
before one of the Right Honble the Lord Proprietors  
Justices for the County in the Province of Maryland to  
keep the peace assigned. Michael Miller of the County Gent and in his  
proper person did before us acknowledge himself indebted to the same  
Lord Proprietor in the sum of ten pounds Sterling money of Great Brittain  
to be paid to his said Lord Proprietor his heirs and assigns and to be made  
and levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements  
Conditionally that if a certain Samuel Barton of Chester Town  
Jailer shall not make his personal appearance at the next Court  
to be held for said County at the said County Court House on the third  
Wednesday in June next then and there to answer unto what shall  
be objected against him on his said Ship's behalf for a breach of  
the peace and in the mean time he is to be of good behavior  
with the said Michael Miller acknowledges himself contented

And now here at this Court to wit at the County Court House  
in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Wednesday in June being  
the nineteenth day of said Month Anno Domini one thousand seven  
hundred thirty and three came the said Samuel Barton and in his  
proper person appeared and prayed his said Recognizance might  
be deferred ordered by this Court here that the same Recognizance  
be deferred as prayed Michael Miller his Recognizance as aforesaid  
being taken for the appearance of the said Samuel Barton is by  
this Court here deferred there being no cause shown to the contrary
