The Sheriff of Kent County having informed
the Court that the aforesaid William being summoned in Court to
attend a petty Jury ^{as a Bailiff} in a cause depending at the Castle of
his Lordship against Dennis Long Servant to Benj
Palmer, and that the said William refused to do

the same upon which the Court ordered that the aforesaid William be brought into Court
to answer the same thereupon the same Sheriff brought into Court the aforesaid William
according to the order of the Court aforesaid and the same William appearing. His Court admonish-
ing him and Mr. Josiah Francis ^{the Judge in this Court} informing him that he had found him it was to do as
what was required by the Court. The same William replied in Court to the same
Attorney and told him the same Attorney that he had a great deal of Impudence
to talk to him. Thereupon the Court adjudges the same William to be fined
for using such Liberties in Court it being to the dishonouring of the same.
Therefore it is considered by this Court to wit at the Court House in the
Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in August being the twenty fourth
day of said Month Anno Domini 1733 Thousand Seven hundred and thirty three that the aforesaid
William Hill be fined the sum of two hundred pounds of Tobacco for his Misbehavior
aforesaid to be paid and applied towards the use of the free School in said County and
also pay of sum of two hundred seventy three pounds of Tobacco fees Accruing on the
promises aforesaid to the Officers of this Court

ordered by this Court that John Gresham Gentleman Sheriff of said County keep the aforesaid
William in safe Custody until the fine aforesaid shall be satisfied
