 as to the said Indictment go thereof without day and that she be therefrom  
 acquitted And that she pay unto the officers of this Court the Sum of one  
 Thousand and forty three pounds of Tobacco Cost accruing on the premises and

ordered by the Court here that she be committed in John Gresham Sher<sup>o</sup> of this  
 County's Custody untill she shall pay the fees on the premises and  
 after which came into Court a certain John Sturgis and William Clarke  
 both said County's planters and did undertake to pay all fees on the Indictment  
 and against the said Susanna Hill and thereupon the said Susanna is acquitted

 of the said Hill in the Sum of ten per Sterd Each for y<sup>e</sup> appear.  
 Susanna Hill } of the said Susanna at the then next Nov<sup>r</sup> Court. The same  
 Susanna being alledged to be sick the same was continued untill  
 this Court here and now at this Court by this 18<sup>th</sup> Day of March 1728 the said  
 Susanna is and ordered that the said Negro be disfranchised nothing being offered  
 to the contrary &c. Thereupon the said John Ashley and Phil Hills  
 Recognizance is by this Court here disfranchised

William Beavis at the same time and entered into Recognizance in the  
 Sum of five pounds Sterd for the appearance of Mary Beavis his wife as  
 a Prosecutor against the said Susanna. at the then next Nov<sup>r</sup> Court fold  
 The said Susanna being said to be sick the same was continued untill this  
 present Court and now at this Court by this 28<sup>th</sup> Day of March 1728 the said Mary  
 is and ordered that the said Recognizance be disfranchised. Thereupon the same  
 William's Beavis's Recognizance is by this Court here disfranchised

Lordship } Information That both the said Richard at last Novemb<sup>r</sup>  
 Court entered into recognizance in the Sum of ten pounds Sterd for  
 his appearance to this Court &c. And at the same time Edward  
 Richard Foulson } Worrill and D<sup>r</sup> Jacob Plome as his Sureties entered into  
 recognizance in the Sum of five per Sterd Each for y<sup>e</sup> said  
 appearance and now at this Court the said Richard in his proper person  
 appeared and pray his Recognizance and his Sureties as aforesaid might be disfranchised  
 and nothing being offered to the contrary It is ordered by the Court here that the  
 same be disfranchised. The Court here discharges the same &c.
