

(c) To the Children's Home of the Eastern Shore of Maryland, Diocese of Easton, Talbot County, Maryland, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

To the gifts, bequests and devises contained in the Last Will and Testament of Bettie Nax, late of Baltimore City, deceased, bearing date of the 6th day of August, 1919, and recorded in the Office of the Register of Wills for Baltimore City in Wills Liber H. W. J. No. 140, folio 355, to the Most Reverend James Cardinal Gibbons, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore for the Time being and his Successors in the Archepiscopal See of Baltimore According to the Discipline and Government of the Roman Catholic Church, a corporation sole, The Frederick Academy of the Visitation in Frederick City, Maryland, St. James Home for Boys of Baltimore City, St. Joseph's Seminary, Rt. Reverend William W.
