

BENEFIT ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS.

4. An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the Board finds that—

(a) He has registered for work at and thereafter has continued to report at a re-employment office in accordance with such regulations as the Board may prescribe.

(b) He has made a claim for benefits in accordance with the provisions of section 6 (a) of this Act.

(c) He is able to work, and is available for work.

(d) Prior to any week for which he claims benefits he has been totally unemployed for a waiting period of two weeks (and for the purposes of this subsection, two weeks of partial unemployment shall be deemed to be equivalent to one week of total unemployment). Such weeks of total or partial unemployment or both need not be consecutive. No week shall be counted as a week of total unemployment for the purposes of this subsection:

(1) If benefits have been paid with respect thereto.

(2) unless the individual was eligible for benefits with respect thereto in all respects except for the requirements of subsections (b) and (e) of this section;

(3) unless it occurs within the thirteen consecutive weeks preceding the week for which he claims benefits, provided that this condition shall not interrupt the payment of benefits for consecutive weeks of unemployment nor require any individual who, prior to the first day of his benefit year, shall have accumulated such two waiting period weeks, to accumulate more than three additional waiting period weeks during his ensuing benefit year;

(4) unless it occurs after benefits first could become payable to any individual under this act.

(e) He has within the first four out of the last five completed calendar quarters immediately preceding the first day of his benefit year, earned wages of not less than sixteen times his weekly benefit amount.

DISQUALIFICATION FOR BENEFITS.

5. An individual shall be disqualified for benefits—

(a) For the week in which he has left work voluntarily without good cause, if so found by the Board, and for not less than the one or more than the five weeks which imme-
