

The District Board of School Trustees shall have the power, by unanimous vote, to refuse to accept the original assignment of any teacher who is provided for in any school under the board's jurisdiction, and upon the notification of such refusal the County Superintendent shall name another teacher for each teacher so refused by the district board; provided, however, that the County Superintendent shall not be required to name more than three teachers for any one place in said school.

No teacher shall have the power to dismiss pupils or close the school during school hours unless in case of emergency without the consent of the District Board of Trustees or the County Superintendent or the County Board of Education.

A majority of the Board of School Trustees shall have the power to appoint a janitor for schools under their jurisdiction, but this provision shall not apply to Montgomery County. One or more of the District Board of School Trustees may visit the schools under their jurisdiction at least one each month and consult with the teachers and principal of the school as to the progress of pupils, condition and cleanliness of the school, and the grounds belonging to same, and give such aid as in their power for the advancement of said school.

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#### CHAPTER 465.

AN ACT to add two new sections to Article 18 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Queen Anne's County," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," said new sections to be known as Sections 260A and 260B and to follow immediately after Section 260 of said Article, providing for the appointment of constables in Queen Anne's County, defining certain duties in addition to the duties now required by law, and providing for their removal for the neglect of such duties.
