(Senate Joint Resolution 13)

A Joint Resolution requesting the State Conservation Commission to prevent erosion on St. Clement's Island.

WHEREAS, the first colonists of Maryland landed on St. Clement's Island in the Potomac River, which island is now a part of St. Mary's County; and

WHEREAS, this island is a historical landmark sacred to all true Marylanders; and

WHEREAS, this island also symbolizes freedom and religious tolerance for a cross was erected to those ideals by the first Maryland settlers on this island; therefore, be it

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the State Conservation Commission be and is hereby requested to protect the Island of St. Clement's from destruction by the waters of the Potomac River and to take suitable steps to prevent further erosion upon said island.
