CHAPTER 295.

(Senate Bill 140)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 1 and 5 of Chapter 199 of the Acts of 1843, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Frederick County", Section 5 of said Act having been amended by Chapter 308 of the Acts of 1927, authorizing the Mutual Insurance Company of Frederick County to insure property against loss or damage by wind-storm, hurricane and other risks and relating to notices of special meetings.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Sections 1 and 5 of Chapter 199 of the Acts of 1843, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Frederick County," Section 5 of said Act having been amended by Chapter 308 of the Acts of 1927, be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments to read as follows:
