

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 157 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Elections", sub-title "Offenses", be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

157. It shall be unlawful for the keeper of any hotel, tavern, store, drinking establishment or any other place where liquors are sold, or for any person or persons, directly or indirectly, to sell, barter, give or dispose of any spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, or intoxicating drinks of any kind within any election district or precinct of this State on the day of any election hereafter to be held in such district or precinct; any person violating the provisions of this section shall be liable for indictment, and shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each offense; provided that in Baltimore City alcoholic beverages may be sold on election days beginning two hours after polls are closed.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That all other laws whether Public General or Public Local Laws, and particularly all provisions of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition) prohibiting the sale of alcoholic beverages on general, special or primary election days, be and they are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1941.

## CHAPTER 849.

(Senate Bill 45)

AN ACT to add a new sub-section to Section 6 of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Alcoholic Beverages", sub-title "Classes of Licenses", said new sub-section to be known as Sub-section G and to follow immediately after Sub-section F of Section 6 of said Article, providing that on January 1st of each year there shall be no closing hour in Baltimore City and Baltimore County for all holders of on-sale licenses; and also to add a new section to said Article to be known as Section 6A and to follow immediately after Section 6 of said Article, providing for the issuance of Special Amusement Permits in connec-
