CHAPTER 875.

(Senate Bill 431)

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 21 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Conveyancing", to be under sub-title "Expiration of Recording", said new section to be known as Section 71A and to follow immediately after Section 71 of said Article, relating to the period of time within which the recording of certain instruments shall operate as actual or constructive notice to certain persons.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new section be and it is hereby added to Article 21 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Conveyancing", to be under sub-title "Expiration of Recording", said new section to be known as Section 71A, to follow immediately after Section 71 of said Article, and to read as follows:

Expiration of Recording.

71A. Any recording pursuant to Section 71 shall be effective only for a period of three (3) years from the date of recording. Thereafter, except as between the parties, the recorded obligation, unless re-recorded, shall be conclusively presumed to have been discharged and shall not operate either as actual or constructive notice to any person.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1941.
