TIES—Commissioners appointed to survey the north east line between, &c. 10 1

Commissioners to set up stones on said lands, at such equal distances as they may deem proper, and mark them No. one, two, &c.; and the line thus surveyed, &c. to be forever the proper divisional line between,

Commissioners to proceed in the discharge of their duty as soon as convenient; and in case of disagreement to appoint one commissioner from an adjoining county, " 2

Their qualifications and powers; to return plots made by them to designate said line, one to clerk of Baltimore county, and the other to the clerk of Carroll county, &c. " 3

Commissioners to receive \$2 each per day; commissioners of Baltimore and Carroll counties to levy on the property of the respective counties such sum as will be sufficient to defray expenses, &c. " 4
