Resolution authorizing the Adjutant General to make a requisition upon the General Government for two Brass Pieces of Ordnance, &c.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be directed to make a requisition on the General Government for two brass field pieces, (six pounders,) as a part of the State's quota of arms, for the use of the Junior Artillerists of the City of Baltimore, to be delivered to Captain J. B. Klunk or his successors, as he or they demand, by his giving bond for their safe keeping and return when demanded.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Passed Mar the treasurer of the western shore, pay out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to David Ridgely the sum of one hundred dollars, as compensation done and services rendered under Resolution number twentyeight, of the General Assembly, passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-eight.
