No. 24.

Resolution authorizing the Adjutant General to furnish  
Captan Thomas G. Harris, with arms, &c. Passed March  
1, 1842.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That*  
the adjutant general of this State, be and is hereby required  
to furnish Captain Thomas G. Harris, of Washington county,  
as many swords, pistols and holsters, as he may want  
for his troop of horse, said number not to exceed sixty-four.

No. 25.

Resolution authorizing the Adjutant General to furnish  
Captain J. M. Anderson, with arms, &c. Passed March  
1, 1842.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That*  
the adjutant general of this State, furnish to Captain J. M.  
Anderson, of the Baltimore Invincibles, fifty muskets; *provi-*  
*ded,* that Captain Anderson, give security for the return of  
the same, to the adjutant general.

No. 26.

Resolution in favor of Francis Valdenar, Executor of Wil-  
liam Layman. Passed March  
1, 1842.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That*  
the treasurer of the western shore, pay out of any unappropri-  
ated money in the treasury, to Francis Valdenar, executor  
of William Layman, late of Montgomery county, deceased,  
who was a revolutionary pensioner of the State of Mary-  
land, the amount of pension, due him at the time of his death  
on the twelfth day of February, eighteen hundred and forty-  
two.
