

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the inhabitants residing between the lines as it at present exists, and the line intended to be established by this law, shall from and after the passage of this act, be to all intents and purposes, citizens of the fourth election district of Allegany county, any other provisions existing heretofore to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER 85.

An act to divorce Mathias Angelmeyer, of the City of Baltimore, from his wife Christianna Angelmeyer. Passed Feb 9, 1842.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorced Mathias Angelmeyer, of the city of Baltimore, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife Christianna Angelmeyer, a vinculo matrimonii.
