with accoutrements to match, whenever they shall be in the Armory, and demanded, on condition that the said Emmart return the rifles and accoutrements now in the hands of the company under his command; and provided also, that the said Emmart or another officer in command of said company give bond with sufficient security for the safe keeping and return of the same to the State of Maryland, when demanded.

Resolution in favor of Captain Benjamin Yingling.

Passed March 10, 1843.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General of this State be and he is hereby authorized and directed to procure and deliver to Captain Benjamin Yingling, for the use of the Carroll Artillery, two brass six pounders, with necessary implements and equipments, the said Captain Yingling giving bond with security for the safe keeping and return of the same when required by the state.

Resolution relative to opening a certain road in Baltimore county.

Passed March 3, 1843.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the time for opening a certain road in Baltimore county, the Dogwood road, heretofore laid out and located by William Crooks, Paul Rust and David Jean, commissioners appointed for that purpose by the commissioners of Baltimore county, be and the same is hereby extended to one year from the passage of this resolution, and that all the proceedings of said commissioners in regard to the locating and opening of said road, be and the same is hereby confirmed, and that it shall be the duty of the commissioners of Baltimore county to cause said road to be opened within the time prescribed by this resolution.
