

**CHAP 50.** and the said trustees, and their successors may and shall from time to time apply the interest or proceeds of such investment or endowment in such manner, for the benefit of said seminary, as they may think proper and best calculated to advance the interest of said seminary, and thereby effectuate the intentions of this legislature in reference to the same.

To educate

**SEC. 4.** *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the said trustees, and they are hereby directed, to educate annually, after the seminary shall be in full operation, one poor orphan child from each county and city.

Repealed.

**SEC. 5.** *And be it enacted,* That all such parts of the Constitution and Form of Government, as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act, (and only for the purpose of giving validity to this particular act,) are hereby repealed, *provided,* this act shall be confirmed by the General Assembly, after the next election, as the Form of Government and Constitution directs.

#### CHAPTER 49.

*An act entitled an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Bank of Maryland.*

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That so much of the seventh fundamental article of the charter of the Patapsco Bank of Maryland, as restricts the president and directors thereof, to the discounting of notes and bills, not having a longer time to run than six months, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Preamble.

**WHEREAS** upon application of the Baltimore and Havre-de-Grace Turnpike Company, it is represented to the General Assembly, that application has been made to said company, by certain proprietors of lands over which said com-
