CHAP. 65. best, and shall in general have and exercise all such rights, privileges and immunities, as by law are incident or necessary to corporations, and may be necessary to corporations herein constituted, and to enable the members to exercise all things concerning the designs of this corporation, of the benevolent relief of the sick and distressed and the promotion of their purposes generally.

Right reserved.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the General Assembly of Maryland, reserves the right to change, alter or amend this charter at any time.

Issue forbid.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to authorise the said corporation to issue any note, scrip, token, device or evidence of debt to be used as currency.

CHAPTER 64.

Passed Jan. 31, 1844.

An act to authorise Henry Harding, administrator of Thomas F. W. Vinson, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, to complete his collections.

Administrator to collect.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, that Henry Harding, administrator of Thomas F. W. Vinson, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, be and he is hereby empowered to collect all fees, taxes and levies, in the same manner in which the said Thomas F. W. Vinson in his lifetime was authorised to do, whilst he was in office, *provided* that if any person or persons, his or her or their representatives against whom any such fees or taxes may have been rendered, will make oath or affirmation before a justice of the peace, that the same has been satisfied or paid, that this act shall not extend to such cases, and *provided also,* that the powers conferred by this act shall not continue in force longer than the first day of March eighteen hundred and forty-six.
