Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Claims relinquished
That the State hereby relinquishes all and every interest which might accrue to the said State, upon condition Condition that the said petitioner assigns and transfers to Dennis Galvin and Michael Smith, and their heirs, or the survivor of them and his heirs, the said lots in trust, to hold the same for such purposes as the resident minister of the Roman Catholic Church, of Hagerstown, shall, from time to time, designate.

CHAPTER 191.

An act to provide for the establishment of District Schools, Passed Mar. 14,
in Charles County. 1839.

WHEREAS, the commissioners appointed to lay off Preamble and divide Charles county, into convenient school districts, have discharged said duty and made return of their proceedings as required by law; *And whereas*, it appears that the school funds belonging to said county are inadequate to the establishment of such schools; *And whereas also*, it is important that some system of education be adopted for the general diffusion of knowledge not only for the benefit of individuals, but of the community at large:—Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Trustees named That the following persons, be and the same are hereby constituted and appointed Trustees of Schools, in their several districts, respectively, as follows, to wit: In the first election district of said 1st Elec. District county, for district school number one, Bennet Dyson, School Dist. No. 1. Uzziel Nally, James Williams, James D. Carpenter, and William Nalley; for district school number two, Alexander Gray, William Smith, John T. B. No. 2. Perry, John Brawner and William Brawner, of Ed.; for district school number three Josephus Brummett, No. 3. William F. Benner, John R. Evans, Richard Speake, and John Price; for district school number four Francis E. Dunnington, Thomas Perry, Lawson Speake, No. 4. Elhanah Franklin and Richard B. Posey; for district
